OFFICIAL PROGRAMME, 1923. SECOND DAY

The course is one mile and a half with turn. The straight-away course is 1 mile, 550 yards, the Henley distance. All senior events to be rowed straightaway. All junior events with the exception of the eights, to be rowed with a turn, unless otherwise arranged.

The Umpire will start the races promptly.

The start will be made by gunshot after the warning, "Get Ready."

Any boat not at its post at the time specified shall be liable to be disqualified by the Umpire.

If the Umpire considers the start a false one, he shall at once recall the boats to their stations by gunshot from the Umpire's boat, and any boat refusing to start again shall be disqualified.

Coaching or any instruction given by any spectator may subject the contestant or crew to disqualification by the Umpire.

Positions number from Grand Stand Side.

Buoys must be turned from port to starboard.

Only winners of trial heats shall qualify for finals.

Definition of Amateur

It shall consist of Clubs which adopt the definition of an amateur, viz.: to be one who has not entered into an open competition; for either stake, public or admission money; or an entrance fee; or competed with or against a professional for any prize; who has never taught, pursued or assisted in the pursuit of athletic exercises as a means of livelihood; whose membership of any rowing or athletic club was not brought about, or does not continue, because of any mutual agreement or understanding, expressed or implied, whereby his becoming or continuing a member of such club would be of any pecuniary benefit to him whatever, direct or indirect; who has never been employed in any occupation involving the use of an oar or paddle; who rows for pleasure or recreation only, and during his leisure hours; and who does not abandon or neglect his usual business or occupation for the purpose of training for more than two weeks during the rowing season; and who has never pawned or sold any medal or trophy won by him in any aquatic or athletic contest; and who has never entered any such under a name other than his own.

Classification of Oarsmen

An intermediate oarsman is one who has never been a winning oarsman in an intermediate or senior race.

An intermediate sculler is one who has never won an intermediate or senior race.

A junior oarsman is one who has never won a race.

A junior sculler is one who has never pulled in a senior or won an intermediate or junior sculling race.

These rules may be varied to permit a junior oarsman or sculler to compete throughout the continuance of any regatta as a junior in as many separate events as such contestant may have been properly entered.

These definitions apply to shell boats only. Races in working boats (which term includes all boats except shell boats) will not affect the status of any oarsman or sculler as a junior or intermediate. Competition with members of his own club, or private matches (a private match being understood to consist of a competition between representatives of not more than four clubs) will not affect the standing as an intermediate or junior oarsman or sculler.

The races are open to the members of all Canadian Amateur Rowing Clubs affiliated with the Association, which have been duly organized three months prior to the opening of the Regatta, and to all Clubs in England or Europe affiliated with the Amateur Rowing Association of England, and Clubs in the United States recognized by the National Association of Amateur Oarsmen.

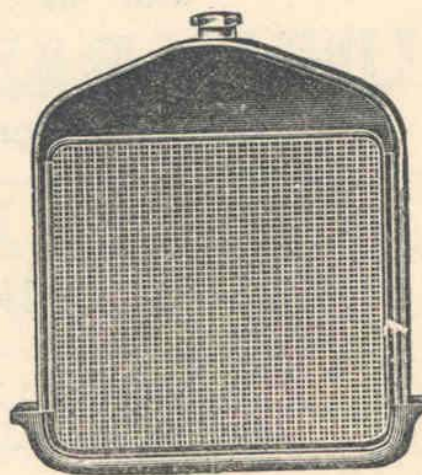
