Definition of Amateur

"It shall consist of Clubs which adopt the definition of an Amateur, viz.: "To be one who has not entered into an open competition; for either a stake, public or admission money, or entrance fee; or competed with or against a professional for any prize; who has never taught, pursued or assisted in the pursuit of athletic exercises as a means of livelihood*; whose membership of any rowing or other athletic club was not brought about, or does not continue, because of any mutual agreement or understanding, expressed or implied, whereby his becoming or continuing a member of such Club would be of any pecuniary benefit to him whatever, direct or indirect; who has never been employed in any occupation involving any use of the oar or paddle; who rows for pleasure or recreation only, and during his leisure hours, and who does not abandon or neglect his usual business or occupation for the purpose of training for more than two weeks during a rowing season** and who has never pawned or sold any medal or trophy won by him in any aquatic or athletic contest, and who has never entered in any such contest under a name other than his own."

*This clause is intended especially to prevent any so-called Amateur Oarsmen being surreptitiously compensated for rowing, as for instance, by being furnished lucrative employment in sinecure positions.

**The Executive Committee of the Association have decided that the last rule of this definition does not apply to time taken up by contestants in travelling to and from regattas.

A sweep oarsmen, who has won a Junior Sweep-oared race, is not eligible to row in any other Junior Sweep-oared race, but can row in any Senior race, providing he makes weight.

A Sculler, who has won a Junior Sculling race, is not eligible to row in any other Junior Sculling race, but can row in any Senior race, providing he makes weight.

The above clauses do not prevent an Oarsman, who has won a Junior Sweep-oared race, from entering in a Junior Sculling race, or vice-versa.

Draw to be made and published prior to the first day of the Regatta.

The 140 lb and 150 lb classes to weigh in each day between 10 and 12 a.m. Any man overweight will be allowed to report to the Clerk of Scales for reweighing up to one hour before his race.

High School Events to require entries from two Clubs to fill.

The straightaway course is 1 mile, 550 yards, the Henley distance. All events to be rowed straightaway.

The Umpire will start the races promptly.

The start will be made by gunshot after the warning, "Get Ready."

Any boat not at its post at the time specified shall be liable to be disqualified by the Umpire.

If the Umpire considers the start a false one, he shall at once recall the boats to their stations by gunshot from the Umpire's boat, and any boat refusing to start again shall be disqualified.

Coaching or any instruction given by any spectator may subject the contestant or crew to disqualification by the Umpire.
