

The Henley Through the Years

The crowd sits in hushed expectancy, eyes peering up the broad, still reaches of the Old Welland Canal just south of Port Dalhousie. A voice shouts, "Here they come!" and a thousand voices take up the cry. Then, with bronzed backs bending and long oars glistening in the afternoon sun, come the graceful shells, gliding down the sweep of water toward the finish line.

It's the Henley—classic event of North American rowing—which for years has made Port Dalhousie and St. Catharines the summer-time mecca for rowers from all parts of the continent.

Introduced to Canada from England, Canadian rowing took for its feature regatta the name of the event in which scullers the world over have competed on the storied Thames River. Thus the Royal Canadian Henley became a dominant part of Canadian sport tradition, governed by the C.A.A.O. and sponsored here in St. Catharines by an enthusiastic group of oarsmen and loyal lovers of rowing—the Henley Aquatic Association.

The Royal Canadian Henley has become a part of St. Catharines tradition, too, for since 1904 the annual summer regatta has been held on the ideal Port Dalhousie course, just a few minutes' drive from Canada's growth city. The support of the city has put the Henley on the world sports map and has kept it there through steady, progressive interest. Building of the fine steel and concrete grandstand on the course at Port Dalhousie was another milestone in the development of the annual event.

As the graceful shells glide across the dappled water in the summer sun—singles or pairs, heavy eights or fours—there's many a great oarsman pulling his weight in spirit. You close your eyes just a trifle, relax a bit, and you can see Jack Guest or Lou Scholes stroking it up to win the prized singles championship a few years back. Then you remember that these two champions, along with Joe Wright and Bob Pearce, went on from their triumphs here to win the world-famed Diamond Sculls, top event at the Royal Henley Regatta in England and greatest prize in world rowing.


The Henley has become steeped in tradition as, year after year through its 64-year history, the cream of Canadian and American manhood gathers to vie for honors in what is probably the "purest" amateur sport existing. Rowers have entered the Henley representing points scattered from Nova Scotia to British Columbia and from New York to St. Louis.

Detroit and Philadelphia have probably been the most active American rowing cities to be represented at the local regatta regularly, but New York, Boston, Buffalo and Princeton have almost always had entries. The Henley normally has been held one week after the N.A.A.O. regatta in the United States, and the two events combine to form a top summer drawing card for the continent's oarsmen.

A certain indication of the growth and permanence of the event, the 64th Henley this year boasts the largest entry list in history. Participants and specators—bonded together in their mutual love of rowing—have brought the Royal Canadian Henley to this peak, and together they will carry it on through the years to higher and greater pinnacles.



- All members of High School crews must be bona fide day students in regular attendance.
- All members of High School crews must be under 21 years of age on the day of the Regatta.
- Entries of High School crews for regattas must come through a rowing club, which is a member of the C.A.A.O.
 - 4. Entry must be made in the name of the school represented.
- 5. A certificate must be furnished by the Principal of the school, along with the entry for each regatta, stating that all members of the crew from his school have been in regular attendance at the school for the six (6) months immediately prior to the regatta.
 - 6. Composite crews will NOT be allowed.

Definition of Amateur

"It shall consist of Clubs which adopt the definition of an Amateur, viz.: "To be one who has not entered into an open competition; for either a stake, public or admission money, or entrance fee; or competed with or against a professional for any prize. who has never taught, pursued or assisted in the pursuit of athletic exercises as a means of livelihood*; whose membership of any rowing or other athletic club was not brought about, or does not continue. because of any mutual agreement or understanding, expressed or implied, whereby his becoming or continuing a member of such Club would be of any pecuniary benefit to him whatever, direct or indirect; who has never been employed in any occupation involving any use of the oar or paddle; who rows for pleasure or recreation only, and during his leisure hours, and who does not abandon or neglect his usual business or occupation for the purpose of training for more than two weeks during a rowing season** and who has never pawned or sold any medal or trophy won by him in any aquatic or athletic contest, and who has never entered in any such contest under a name other than his own."

*This clause is intended especially to prevent any so-called Amateur Oarsmen being surreptitiously compensated for rowing, as for instance, by being furnished lucrative employment in sinecure positions.

**The Executive Committee of the Association have decided that the last rule of this definition does not apply to time taken up by contestants in travelling to and from regattas.

A Junior sweep oarsman is a contestant who has never won a sweep-oared race.

A Junior sculler is a contestant who has never won a sculling race.

A sweep oarsman, who has won a Junior sweep-oared race, is not eligible to row in any other Junior sweep-oared race, but can row in any Intermediate or Senior race, providing he makes weight.

A sculler, who has won a Junior sculling race, is not eligible to row in any other Junior sculling race, but can row in any Senior race, providing he makes weight.

A sweep oarsman, who has won an intermediate sweep-oared race, is not eligible to row in any other Junior or Intermediate sweep-oared race, but can row in any Senior race, providing he makes weight.

The above clauses do not prevent an oarsman, who has won a Junior sweep-oared race, from entering in a Junior sculling race, or vice-versa.
