... AN OUTLINE OF ... THE ROYAL CANADIAN HENLEY


Although amateur rowing really became organized in the year 1880, since this was the date of the founding of the Canadian Association of Amateur Oarsmen, regattas had been held by various clubs in different cities since 1856.

However, with the formation of the Canadian Association of Amateur Oarsmen in 1880, the annual Henley regattas came into being with the first Henley staged at Toronto in 1880. Hamilton played host to the Henley in 1881, 1885, 1889, 1893, 1894 and 1895; Lachine was the scene in 1882, 1886, 1890; Ottawa in 1883, 1887, and 1901; Brockville in 1896, 1897, 1899 and 1902; Toronto, besides having the first Henley, also was the site in 1884, 1888, 1898 and 1900. In 1891 Barrie was chosen to stage the annual rowing classic.

Of all these sites, the favoured spot was Hamilton Beach since it was possible to row on either the lake or bay. After years of holding regattas in different cities, the C.A.A.O. finally decided in 1903 that it would be much more satisfactory if the annual event could be staged in a permanent location. It was then suggested by Mr. Norris King and Mr. C. W. Hodgetts, that the Welland Canal be inspected. A committee, appointed by Mr. C. A. MacDonnell, president of the C.A.A.O., viewed the St. Catharines course on the Welland Canal. The one and one-half miles of placid water, sheltered from winds, was declared ideal.

So it was that in 1903 the Henley came to St. Catharines. With its coming also came the organization of the St. Catharines Rowing and Canoe Club with the following officers: President, C. W. Hodgetts; Vice-president, Dr. W. H. Merritt; Secretary-Treasurer, A. Courtney Kingston; Captain, R. B. Hamilton. After several conferences had been held between the officials of the club, the C.A.A.O., and the city council, an agreement was made whereby the C.A.A.O. undertook to hold its annual champion-ships at St. Catharines for all time as long as St. Catharines provided suitable accommodations. Through donations by the city, the village of Port Dalhousie, and public subscription, enough money was raised to provide the necessary facilities. In 1904 the first clubhouse of the St. Catharines Rowing Club and the grandstand were erected. In 1920 the new boathouse at the foot of Ann Street was built to replace the original building.

In 1929 the old grandstand, with its limited seating capacity was blown down, and through the efforts of the Henley Aquatic Association, a handsome new steel and concrete stand, accommodating 3,500 spectators, with an excellent view of the course, was erected.

So much for the material side of the Henley. From a competitor's standpoint the Henley attracted more interest each year. From a one-day affair, it progressed through the years, to two days, then added morning events to accommodate the entries, also introduced the schoolboy events, and now requires four days of racing to stage the annual rowing presentation. Crews from all parts of Canada and the United States now make the Henley a "must" on their aquatic schedule.

Indicative of the growth and stability of the Royal Canadian Henley, is the annual entry list. Even this year, with the Olympic games being staged in England, the entry list is more than impressive.

So it is that the Henley, introduced to Canada from England, governed by the Canadian Association of Amateur Oarsmen, and sponsored by the Henley Aquatic Association, an enthusiastic group of rowing devotees, has established itself as a dominant part of the Canadian—yes—the North American summer sports picture.

Leanders Worthy Olympic Representatives

Winners of the Hanlan Memorial Trophy, emblematic of the Henley's senior eights championship, six times since their re-organization in 1927, the Leander Boat Club of Hamilton again provides Canada with its eight-oared crew representation in this year's Olympics. This is getting to be a bit of a habit with the Hamilton oarsmen, as they also represented Canada at the Olympics in Los Angeles in 1932, and at Berlin in 1936, the last year the Olympics were staged.

Whenever you can get anybody from Toronto praising anything from Hamilton, brothers it wolls must be comething. Writing in the er, it really must be something. Writing in the Tely, following the Leanders' triumph at the Olympic trials, aquatic expert Fitzgerald had this

Miles make champions.

Dreary, hard slugging, dull and body-wearying

miles. But, without them, no championship is ever attained.

When honors are gained and plaudits are heard, those miles become a thing of joy.

Almost every sport requires these tiresome miles, but on the water, where crews must train, the constant swing of blade or sweep-oar is a decided must.

Today an eight-oared crew from Hamilton Leanders Rowing Club is the talk of Canadian rowing circles. In winning the right to represent Canada at the coming Olympic games, this crew painted a picture that was a joy to any and all who might have a slight smattering of rowing knowledge.

They won the right for the ocean trip by a margin of six lengths over the field. But it wasn't so much the margin as it was the beautiful rhythm in their shell as they swept to victory.

No sooner had the race ended when men, wise in rowing, and veterans of many a race and regatta, started to buzz about this crew. There was a very evident sparkle of true admiration as talk went round the grandstand about this eight. And rightly so.

Getting back to the opening remark, regarding miles, and small wonder this crew rows as they

Hamilton has long had big men and heavy eights. In 1936 Bob Hunter, coach of the club, took an eight to the Berlin games but they failed to get in the money. A poor shell, newly made but with a twist in it, didn't help, but the crew lacked championship qualities.

Bob retired from coaching about 10 years ago and Paddy Cline, his assistant, took over. And here, again comes a pay-off. When two men work together for years using the same system, the stepping out of one does not make any decided change in the set-up of a club. In short, the coaching moves along on the same familiar grounds.

A likeable and well-versed coach, Paddy kept interest in rowing alive through the long war years. Then, when the Olympics were decided upon, he had a nucleus of a heavy eight. Came the weeding out, the fitting of the shell, the balancing of the weight and the long, needed miles to mold the eight men into a single unit of energy, power and rhythm.

All last summer, right up until the ice closed in, this eight worked. Then throughout the winter months they worked indoors. Came the break-up and they were at it again on Hamilton Bay. The Olympic trials triumph was the first pay-off and well-earned.

Cline has a crew that is young, big and a picture of perfect unison. True, they may not win the Olympic title, but unless poor racing luck strikes them, they'll make a decided impression in England come August.

Veteran oarsmen, who have seen this crew, think highly of their chances of victory. Let's hope their judgment bears fruit.

Schoolboy Regatta Honors to St. Catharines

Racking up the bumper total of 84 points, the St. Catharines Collegiate Institute completely dominated the third annual Canadian Schoolboy Rowing Association Regatta held here on the Henley course on Saturday, June 5.

Their big eight made it an international sweep by winning by three open lengths over St. Joseph's High School of Buffalo in a two-boat race, the other crews having scratched. In all, the St. Catharines collegians copped five firsts, two seconds, and two thirds.

Second-place honors went to Cathedral High School of Hamilton who gained 30 points from their first place in the 150-pound eights. Toronto Western Tech collected 20 points for a first in the 150-pound fours to take over third spot, while Ottawa's Glebe Collegiate brought up the rear with eight points.

Two pairs of schoolboys stole the spotlight. Greg and Frank Murphy, St. Catharines brothers, and recently crowned United States heavy doubles champions, added the Canadian schoolboy title in a row-over. The other pair were Ron Cardwell and Doug Turner of Buffalo's Lafayette High School, who captured the 150-pound open doubles, then rowed in the Buffalo Tech fours, and finished runners-up to the Murphys in the open heavy doubles.

St. Catharines also turned in the best times in their eight-oared events, doing the mile straightaway in the Canadian heavy race in 5:49. The same crew took the open heavy title in 5:45 4-5.

Four Firsts to St. Kitts at Brockville Regatta



Thousands of spectators lined both shores of the long pond at Toronto's Centre Island on Dominion Day and watched the St. Catharines Rowing Club pile up 45 points to win the 47th annual Dominion Day Regatta. Trailing the St. Kitts delegation were Toronto Dons with 25 points, Hamilton Leanders with 14 and Toronto Argos with 12.

The performance of the St. Catharines Club's eight-oared crews highlighted the day-long regatta. Two Garden City crews won heats in the lightweight division and then staged a thrilling

final with the St. Catharines "A" crew forging to the front in the last two or three strokes to edge their club-mates.

This treatment was repeated in the heavy eights with St. Kitts winning both heats and then waging another close duel to finish one, two in the final.

Other first place awards won by the Garden City oarsmen went to the lightweight and heavyweight fours; the 145-pound junior singles to Roy Barrett, and the high school singles to Jim Mc-Intosh.

Hamilton and Ottawa Will Represent Canada in Rowing at Olympics

Canada's hopes in the 1948 summer Olympic rowing events, to be held in England next month, will hinge on oarsmen from two clubs—the Hamilton Leanders in the eight-oared crews, and Ottawa Rideau represented in the doubles by Ted Graves and Gabe Beaudry.

The selections were made after the Olympic trials held here in St. Catharines on the Royal Canadian Henley course on Saturday, June 26.

The selection committee, made up of T. H. C. Allison, W. G. Crawford, W. M. Ross, and S. M. Elliott, decided not to sponsor the singles, pair oars, or fours-without-cox winners, comprising the other three events of the trials.

J. L. Murray, secretary of the Canadian Association of Amateur Oarsmen, announced the committee's decision and it was believed that the decision not to sponsor the winners was because

the times did not measure up to Olympic require-

The decision affected the Toronto Argonauts, who won the fours, Theo Dubois of Winnipeg, who took the singles in a close finish, and the pair-oars of J. Smith and W. Blue of the Ottawa Rideaus, only entry in this class.

Chief interest of the trials was on the senior eights. Once again, as in 1932 and 1936, it was Hamilton Leanders who copped the trials and will represent the Dominion at the Olympics. The crew is made up of Ron Cameron, Bill McConnell, Jack Zirewich, Marvin Hammond, Al Stephani, Art Griffiths, Bob Christmas, stroke Pete Green, and coxswain Walt Robertson. Paddy Cline is coach of the scarlet runners. In winning the trials, the Leanders defeated St. Catharines and Ottawa. (Continued on Next Page)



Definition of An Amateur

The definition of an Amateur, as adopted by the Canadian Association of Amateur Oarsmen is: "To be one who has not entered into an open competition; for either a stake, public or admission money, or entrance fee; or competed with or against a professional for any prize; who has never taught, pursued or assisted in the pursuit of athletic exercises as a means of livelihood*; whose membership of any rowing or other athletic club was not brought about, or does not continue, because of any mutual agreement or understanding, expressed or implied, whereby his becoming or continuing a member of such Club would be of any pecuniary benefit to him whatever, direct or indirect; who has never been employed in any occupation involving any use of the oar or paddle; who rows for pleasure or recreation only, and during his leisure hours, and who does not abandon or neglect his usual business or occupation for the purpose of training for more than two weeks during a rowing season** and who has never pawned or sold any medal or trophy won by him in any aquatic or athletic contest, and who has never entered in any such contest under a name other than his own."

*This clause is intended especially to prevent any so-called Amateur Oarsmen being surreptitiously compensated for rowing, as for instance, by being furnished lucrative employment in sinecure positions.

**The Executive Committee of the Association have decided that the last rule of this definition does not apply to time taken up by contestants in travelling to and from regattas.

A Junior sweep oarsman is a contestant who has never won a sweep-oared race.

A Junior sculler is a contestant who has never won a sculling race.

A sweep oarsman, who has won a Junior sweep-oared race, is not eligible to row in any other Junior sweep-oared race, but can row in any Intermediate or Senior race, providing he makes weight.

A sculler, who has won a Junior sculling race, is not eligible to row in any other Junior sculling race, but can row in any Senior race, providing he makes weight.

A sweep oarsman, who has won an Intermediate sweep-oared race, is not eligible to row in any other Junior or Intermediate sweep-oared race, but can row in any Senior race, providing he makes weight.

The above clauses do not prevent an oarsman, who has won a Junior sweep-oared race, from entering in a Junior sculling race, or vice-versa.

Draw to be made and published prior to the first day of the Regatta.

The 145-lb. and 155-lb. classes to weigh in each day between 8 a.m. and 12 noon. Any man overweight will be allowed to report to the Clerk of the Scales for re-weighing, up to one hour before his race.
