## New Coach for City Rowing Club



Pres. Ted Nelson of St. Catharines Rowing Club announced last night, at the 1949 opening of the season at the Port Dalhousie shell-house, the appointment of Ralph Cossett, as coach of the cerise-royal blue oarsmen for 1949. A new eight-oared shell built by George Pocock, of Seattle, most famous builder in the world, was presented last night to the St. Catharines Rowing Club by the St. Catharines Lions Club.
