



THE CALDER CLELAND MEMORIAL TROPHY

The Calder Cleland Memorial Trophy was donated by the late W. B. Cleland of St. Catharines who specified that it be rowed for annually, at the Royal Canadian Henley Regatta, at St. Catharines, by high school eight-oared crews in international competition. His purpose in making this magnificent gift to rowing was two-fold: he wished to perpetuate the memory of his son, Calder Cleland, who was killed in action over Sicily while serving with the Royal Canadian Air Force and he wished to encourage young men of high school age in a sport that stressed team work, was truly amateur and cleanly competitive.

W. B. Cleland, himself, chose high school eight-oared rowing as the sport that measured up to this standard and he donated the prize of his collection of antiques and works of art as the trophy to be rowed for in this event.

His donation was the world-famous "Omar Khayyam Wine Jug". This trophy compares with any in the world of sport in value and tops them all in historical interest.

Wrought entirely in silver and inlaid with gold by the Goldsmiths and Silversmiths Guild of Old London, England, in the time of Napoleon the Third of France, it was hand-chased by peerless craftsmen into an object unique in the world of art and breath-taking in its perfection and beauty.

The Guild spent one thousand pounds — a tremendous sum in those days — for its materials alone; its value as an antique piece is anyone's guess. Certainly its worth at the present time is such that the safe- guarding of it is given serious attention by the club winning it. And its value increases as the years roll by.

The "Omar Khayyam Wine Jug" — now known as the "Calder Cleland Memorial Trophy" — was formally presented with the compliments of the Goldsmiths and Silversmiths of Old London, to the Empress Eugenie on the occasion of her marriage to the Emperor Napoleon.

The Calder Cleland Cup was put up for competition in the 1946 Royal Canadian Henley and excitement ran high as race-time for the event drew closer. There was an underlying note of sadness there, tco, for W. B. Cleland had passed away shortly before the regatta and "his race" was being run without him bearing witness. As the crews rowed up the course to the start, the people in the grandstand and lining the banks stood with bared heads and in silence in tribute to a great sportsman. There was a day steeped in drama!

For the St. Catharines Collegiate Institute eight, rowing in the "Jordan" — the shell that was donated by W. B. Cleland to the St. Catharines Rowing Club that year — outrowed the top competition of the continent as represented by Philadelphia LaSalles, Wyandotte Roosevelts and Grosse Pointe High School and came down the course to win by one length of open water in the time of 5:28.4.

— To win, too, the greatest trophy in High School rowing: the Calder Cleland Memorial Trophy!





Just fifty years ago, the Royal Canadian Henley Regatta came to its permanent home at St. Catharines. In 1903, the Canadian Henley was held here for the first time and — with the exception of the years 1916 to 1919 when the Regatta was not held on account of the war — the Henley has been rowed here, annually, ever since.

Prior to 1903, the Henley was held at various times at Toronto, Hamilton, Lachine, Ottawa, Brockville and Barrie. The first Henley was held in 1880 at Toronto at the time of the formation of the Canadian Association of Amateur Oarsmen.

After years of holding the Regatta in different cities, the C. A. A. O. decided it would be much more satisfactory if the event could be staged in a permanent location and the Welland canal, here, was recommended. The C. A. A. O. committee inspected the sheltered, placid water of the St. Catharines course and pronounced it ideal. It met all specifications: a mile and one-half straight stretch, protected water to assure rowing in the windiest days, easy access to both Canadian and United States oarsmen and convenient for spectators.

So the Henley came to St. Catharines in 1903 and along with it the St. Catharines Rowing and Canoe Club, forerunner of the present Club, was organized. An agreement was made between C. A. A. O. officials, the city council and the Rowing Club whereby the C. A. A. O. undertook to hold its championships at St. Catharines for all time as long as St. Catharines provided suitable accommodations. Money to provide the necessary facilities was raised through donations by the city of St. Catharines, the (then) Village of Pt. Dalhousie and public subscription. In 1904 the first clubhouse of the St. Catharines Rowing Club and the grandstand were built. In 1920 the new boathouse at the foot of Ann Street was erected to replace the original building.

In 1921 the Henley Aquatic Association, Limited, of St. Catharines was incorporated as a company, granted a charter by the Ontario Government for the promotion of "non-profit-bearing amateur rowing sport" and signed its first contract with the Canadian Association of Amateur Carsmen.

Since that time, the Henley Aquatic Association has sponsored all regattas held on the Royal Canadian Henley Course, providing grandstand, shell accommodations, clubhouse facilities, floats, certain supervisory personnel and all such regatta detail. Funds to finance these obligations are donated by the city of St. Catharines and the industries and citizens of this district: staunch supporters of a program that is national in scope and has benefitted thousands of young men who have trained for the annual rowing competitions held here.

In 1929, through the efforts of the Henley Aquatic Association, the present steel and concrete grandstand, accommodating 3,500 spectators, was erected to replace the original wooden stand.

To return now to the first Royal Canadian Henley Regatta to be held here, August 7th, 1903. - The weather was "Henley weather" - clear, sunny; the grandstand was filled, the banks lined with people - more than 10,000 saw this opening regatta. The great Ned Hanlan, present among the throng, declared the course the finest he had ever seen.

And that first day, the Argonaut Senior Eight, stroked by Joe Wright, Senior, smashed the world's record in the time of 6:33 and 3/5!






