The Umpire will start the races promptly.
Any boat not at its post at the time specified shall be liable to be disqualified by the Umpire.

If the Umpire considers the start to be a false one he shall at once recall the boats to their stations by gunshot from the Umpire's boat and any boat refusing to start again shall be disqualified.

Coaching or any instruction given by any spectator may subject contestant or crew to disqualification by the Umpire.

But you row it every stroke and all the way.

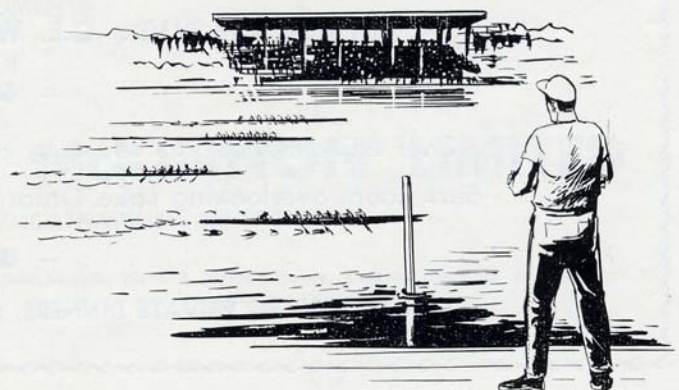
Have you won? — that's hard to say,

And his chest is out for all the world to see!

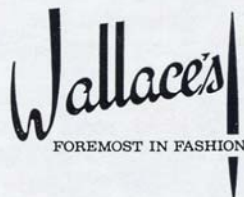
So there's no question, you have done it —

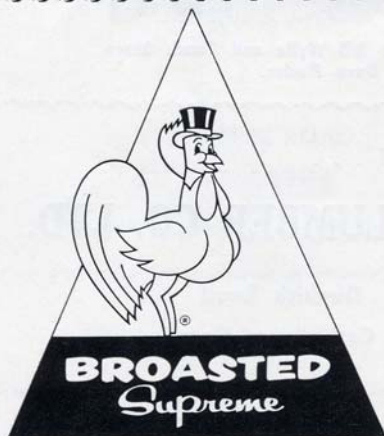

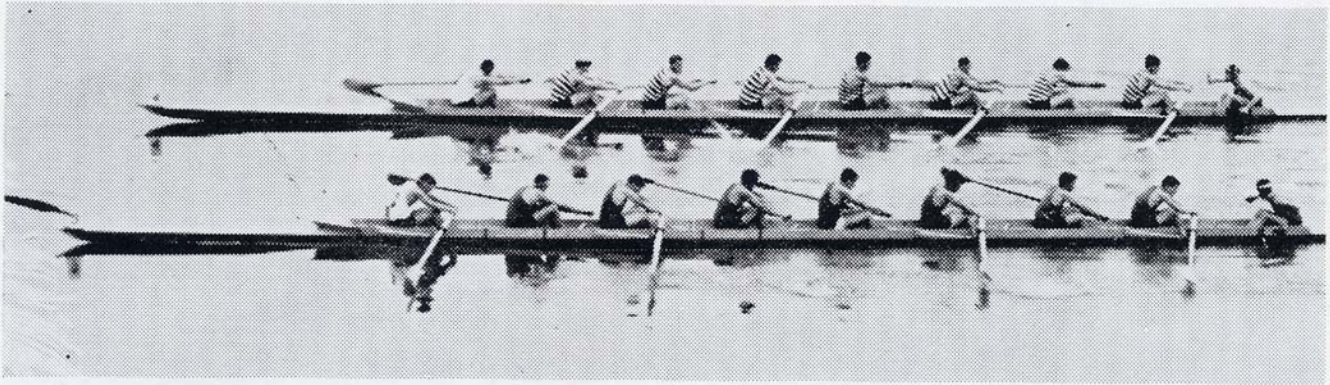

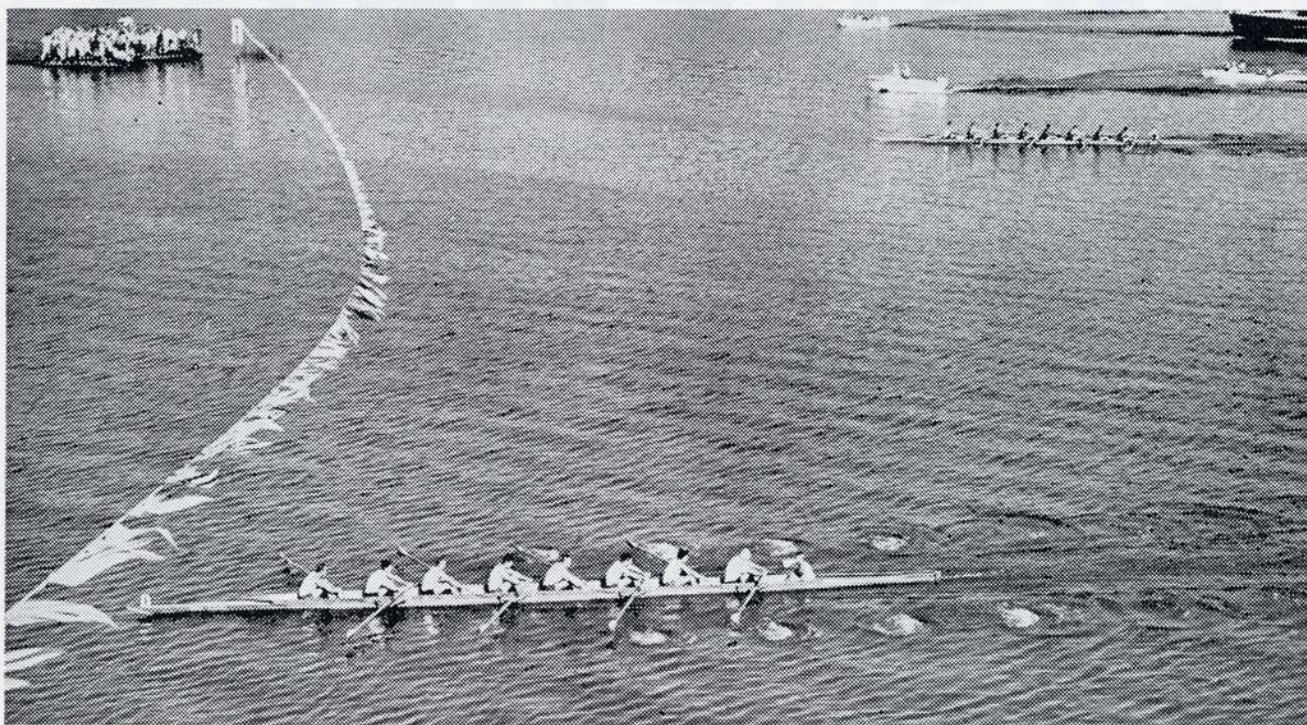

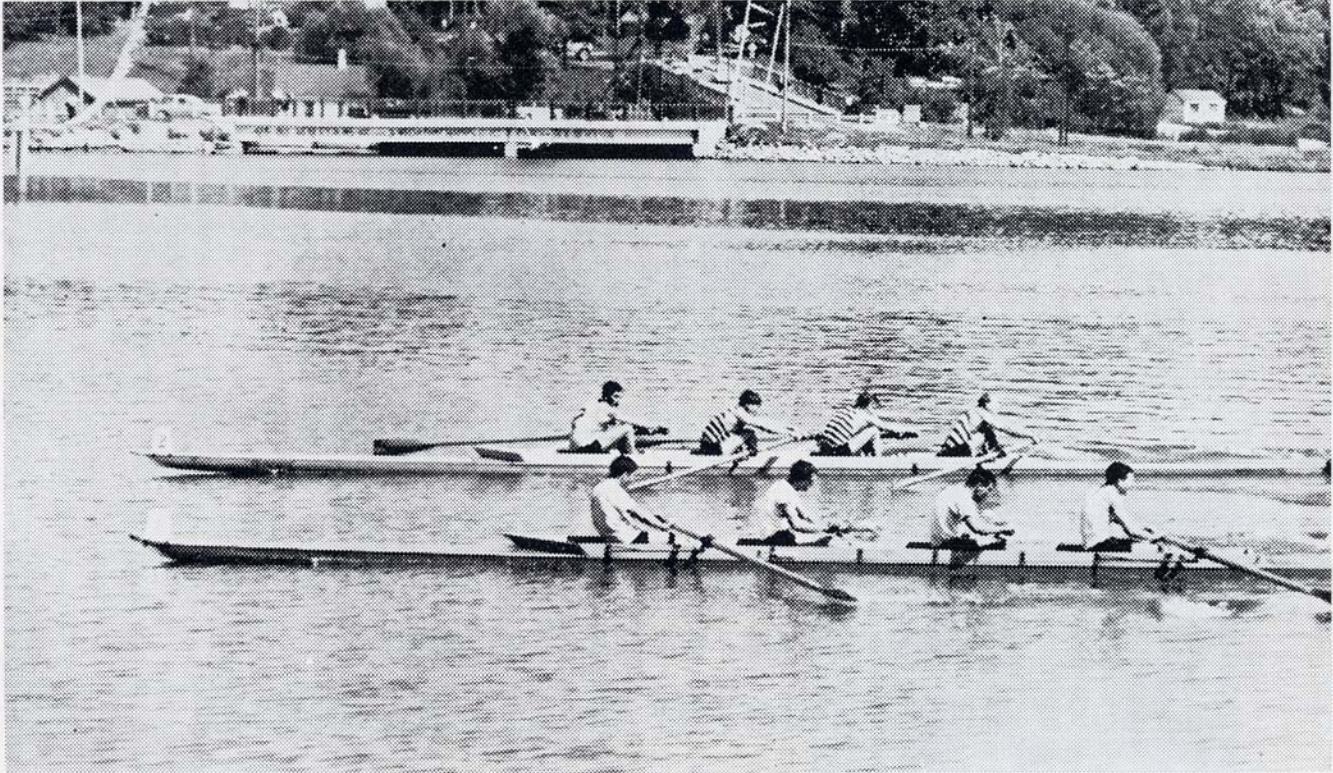

"A 19th Century Car Ride"

It does not take anything away from Henry Ford's monumental achievements to bring attention to the fact that he was not by any means the first producer of automobiles and he worked for 15 years after the turn of the century to produce the car that was to become a household word and endless source of material for song and joke, the Model T. But Henry's name does crop up in the pre 1900 days in a Sunday supplement story of a reporter's ride in an automobile. It was called, 'A Ride with Henry' and it went like this . . . "Mr. Ford, the automobileer, began by giving his steed three or four sharp jerks at the right side of the seat — in order, he said, to drive the charge of air and gasoline into the exploding cylinder — with incomparable swiftness the machine picked up its speed and glided into the snowy, wind-blown street. The puffing of the engine assumed a higher key. She was flying along at eight miles an hour . . . "Hold on tight" said Ford, "when we strike the asphalt we will have a run." "How fast?" "Twenty-five miles an hour." "Hold on, I'll get out." Bang! Bang! That was the warning bell under the seat. Whiz . . . she picked up speed with infinite rapidity. As she rushed on, there was a clattering behind — the new noise of the automobile . . . I began to have a creepy feeling and told Ford I wanted to get out. "Nonsense," he replied, "No danger . . . I'll wager that a race horse cannot be hauled up in less than one minute, but we'll do it in six feet . . ." With that the automobileer pushed something, and with the suddenness of complete collapse, the steed came to a standstill.
