



A MESSAGE FROM THE MINISTER OF LABOUR

This Department is concerned with people. We are concerned with their economic welfare in terms of employment. We are concerned with their physical welfare through the enforcement of safety regulations. We are concerned that they have an opportunity to contribute their skills and knowledge to the development of this Province.

In recent years the Department has developed and revitalized policies and programs to meet the changing economic and social goals of the people of Ontario.

In the field of Labour-Management Relations the Department has streamlined its procedures and improved its services to help maintain labour peace and harmony.

To fill the need for skilled tradesmen and provide opportunities for the unemployed and underemployed, the Industrial Training Branch has broadened and accelerated its training programs. In the area of safety our inspectors enforce legis-

lation to protect the labour force and general public.

To prevent exploitation of the labour force, the Labour Standards Branch administers legislation for Minimum Wage, Hours of Work and Vacations with Pay, Fair Wage schedules and Industrial Standards.

The Ontario Human Rights Commission seeks to ensure equal opportunity for all regardless of race, creed, colour, ethnic origin or age in employment, public accommodation and housing.

The Women's Bureau assists the growing number of women in the work force while the office of the Ontario Athletics Commissioner promotes and assists amateur sports throughout the Province.

As the problems of society become more and more complex, greater demands are made on Government services for solutions. These are challenges we welcome as we review and strengthen our programs to better serve the needs of the people of Ontario.







his face;


The man who taught you how to row,





"HORSES HEADS AND GAS TANKS"

The first gas buggies that appeared on North American streets strayed little in design from the horse drawn type. 
