





CRAIG SWAYZE 1927 - 2000



Many of the new facilities, which helped bring the 1967 North American Rowing Championships and the 1970 and 1999 World Rowing Championship to St. Catharines, were the products of Craig Swayze's mind who was pulling on an oar in his native city long before he realized the Niagara District existed.

Craig's uncle, Bert Craig, a longtime active oarsman and official in Brockville, was, in turn, the man who introduced the 10 year old to the sport which has become a backbone of the Summer Olympic Games.

But it was a pretty Canadian face and a wonderful personality which convinced Craig to make this city his permanent home.

"By 1947, I had advanced from being a coxswain for the various Brockville junior and senior fours and had my own seat in the boat which qualified me for the straight junior lightweight four at the Canadian Henley," Swayze recalled during some rare between-race downtime at the World's here last summer.

"I still remember the excitement. We loaded the shell into the hold of the SS Kingston at the Brockville Dock, transferred it to the Dalhousie City (a cross-lake Toronto-to-Dalhousie combined passenger ship and freighter) and sailed the balance of the 25 miles to St. Catharines."

Swayze was a self-effacing young man - a trait which stayed with him his 73 years - but allowed that, yes, they had returned to Brockville Sunday with gold medals clutched in their hands.

And it was in St. Catharines, that in 1952, he met local rowing enthusiast Lois Preston through mutual friends. Two years later, they were married. But as those connected with rowing know full well, that amateur sport doesn't attract million dollar salaries and must be treated as a hobby.

Craig was also establishing a newspaper career - first at his hometown Brockville Recorder and Times, then Canadian Press in Toronto where he was the regular rowing correspondent, and finally, almost 40 years here at the Standard, when an opening came up in the sports department. He eventually became the assistant managing editor.

It was during his 15 years in sports that we became fast friends. There were only two of us on staff and we often joked about the calamity if we both thought we had the same day off. Fortunately, this never happened - at least we never let it be known.

The Swayzes weren't a one-interest family. In his youth, Craig had played every sport from football to junior hockey to basketball, and the young couple continued in that excitement during the thrilling local junior A hockey Memorial Cup days of the Teepees and Black Hawks. While some people became ardent local rowing enthusiasts, no couple I knew ever devoted as much time, 12 months a year, as the Swayzes.

Even last summer when Craig was ailing, Lois drove him to the 3,500-seat grandstand on daily basis, where, with Bill Stevenson, they supervised that part of the huge undertaking.

Craig covered rowing championships all over the world, sat in on policy-making by FISA (International Rowing Federation) delegates; was chairman of the North American Rowing Championships; was on virtually every committee of both local World Rowing Championships; was in the forefront in upgrading the course to international standards; and battled with others to successfully retain the Canadian Henley and Canadian Schoolboy at their present location.

R. Craig Swayze died here last February after a lingering illness.

He leaves his wife Lois; daughter Dr. Kathy Swayze-Wismer, who was chief of the World Rowing medical staff here less than a year ago; a son, Kevin; son-in-law Rick Wismer; grandchildren Craig, Kenneth and Christopher.

The deepest sympathy is extended from local people in all walks of life - especially those whose way of life has been changed by rowing and other sports.



Glossary of Rowing Terms

Aligner - Official who occupies a spot exactly on the starting line so he can adjust the bows of each shell so they are exactly even. Like the Starter, he has the power to signal a false start.

Are You Ready? - Coxswain's or bowman's command preparing crew for executive order which will follow.

Blade - Flat surface of oar at the end, which is used to propel the boat. Various styles are now used, with the present hatchet shape (called cleaver by some), which also comes in a slight variation - the smoothie, as it is smoother and has a slight lip on the top edge. Previously used was the macon, or symmetrical blade. 2) Also called the spoon.

Catch - That point in the stroke cycle at which the blade enters the water.

Check - Amount of interruption of forward movement of the shell which commonly occurs at the catch and sometimes at the release. Can be seen as the shell pitches forward and back during the stroke. 2) It is also a split in the thin wooden skin of the shell.

Course - A recognized waterway upon which rowing races are held. A crew is also said to have rowed a "course" when it rows over the usual race distance in training.

Cox Four - A shell in which four people row, each rowing with a single sweep oar. A coxwain steers the boat and calls the stroke rate and race plan, just as in an eight.

Cox Pair - A shell rowed by two, each using a single sweep oar. The coxswain steers the craft and calls the stroke. The cox may either be sitting in the stern or lying down on his back in the bow.

Coxswain - (Nicknamed Coxie) Member of crew who sits in a stationary seat at the stern, facing forward, or lies in the bow. He is primarily charged with steering and aids in carrying out the strategy of race, including gauging positions of competing crews. Usually selected for their small size and savvy. Coxswains of male crews must weight 121 lbs, and coxies of female crews must weigh 110 lbs. They must weigh in each day and carry extra weights in the boat to be "at weight".

Crab - Upsetting action caused by turning of oar blade in water so that release is either forced or impossible to make. Some crabs result in an oarsman being thrown out of the shell.

Dash - A 500 metre race, usually for eight-oared crews or singles.

Deck - Sections of a shell at bow and stern, covered usually by varnished silk or nylon (or hard fiberglass materials). Bow Deck extends about 12 feet back from the bow to the washboard; Stern Deck extends from the back of coxswain's seat to the rudder post or stern.

Blade Work - Action of blade during stroke, encompassing such techniques as "catch", "feathering", etc., used to describe manner in which oarsman handles his oar.

Body Angle - Amount, at catch or release, or forward or backward lean of oarsman's body from the hips.

Bow - Forward section of shell

Breakage - Damage to equipment. Breakage during the first 20 seconds or 100 metres of a race is grounds for referee recalling all shells and restarting the race.

CARA - See RCA

Concept II - An oar manufacturer located in Morrisville, Vermont, whose oars are used by a majority of rowers throughout the world. Concept II also designed the indoor Rowing Machine, or Ergometer as known by rowers, which is used for training and competitions by rowers and fitness fanatics around the world.

Coxless Four - A shell in which four oarsmen row, each using a single sweep oar. The person in bow usually steers the rudder by use of a tiller wire attached to the toe of one shoe.

Dirigo - Shells built by an American boat builder located in Biddeford, Maine, usually coloured yellow.

Double - A shell in which two scullers row, each using a pair of oars or sculls.

Easy All - The coxswain or bowman's command to his oarsmen to stop rowing.

Eights - Colloquial term used to indicate eight-oared shells, which contain eight rowers and one coxswain. The largest sweep-oared crew, as compared to "fours" or "pairs".

Empacher - A shell manufactured by Empacher, a German boat-building firm, always colored yellow.

False Start - Called when a boat starts before the official command, or when a boat is late to the start. A crew is allowed one false start and is disqualified upon a second.

Feathering - Action of turning oar blade parallel to the surface of the water during the recovery; used to cut down on wind resistance and aid in releasing from the water.

Finish - As part of stroke cycle, the last part of the drive before the release; 2) another name for the release itself; 3) when bow of shell reaches the finish line; 4) sprint or manner in which rows the final portion of race.

FISA - Federation International des Societes d'Aviron or the International Rowing Federation, the governing body of world amateur rowing. Denis Oswald of Switzerland, is the FISA president.

Footstop - The shoe assembly into which each crew member laces his feet in a racing shell. For safety purposes, each footstop is required to have a safety release attached to the heels, so that the rower can quickly get out of the shoes in case of emergency.

Gunwale - Top strip along sides of shell to which riggers are secured.

Heats - Elimination races, held to qualify crews or scullers for semi-finals or finals, depending on the number of entries in each event.

Heavyweight - An oarsman or sculler or crew which is too heavy to qualify as a lightweight entry. Usually an individual weighing over 160 lbs for men, or 130 lbs for women, depending on regatta classifications.

Hudson - A shell produced by Hudson Boat Works of London, Ontario.

Intermediate - An oarsman or sculler who has not won at a qualifying regatta (such as Henley, US National Championships or any International Championships).

Italian Rig - A four which has the No. 2 and No. 3 oarsmen rowing on the same side of the boat. Also known as tandem rig.

Judge-Arbitre - A judge-referee holding his FISA or International Federation licence.

Junior - An oarsman or a sculler who does not reach his 19th birthday in the present year.

Kaschper - A shell produced by Kaschper Racing Shells Ltd. of Lucan, Ontario

Keel - Centre line of shell, running from bow to stern along the bottom; in construction, strengthening member to which ribs are attached.

Knifing In - Under squaring blade for catch so that oar goes too deep in the water when power is applied.

Layback - Amount of backward lean of an oarsman's body at the finish of the drive. Most styles of rowing technique used today have little layback, perhaps 10-15°, being completed with the oarsman sitting almost upright.

Length in Water - Term describing arc in water through which blades move on drive - actually, amount of forward motion of shell while blades are anchored in water.

Let Her Run! - The command to stop rowing.

Lightweight - A male oarsman, sculler or crew which weighs 160 lbs or under. At the Canadian Henley weight classes for men include: 135lb, 145lb and 155lb singles; 140lb Rowers must weigh in each day of their racing, from 7-10a.m., being exactly at or below their required weight (as no re-weigh is allowed).

Master Rower - Masters must be at least 27 years of age, with 8 different age categories for men and women. Categories are based on age, with the average age of the crew classifying the category of each crew.

Missing Water - Faulty catch in which oar blade is not anchored properly in the water, resulting in missing part of initial drive

Oar - Sweep oar approximately 12 feet long, and sculling oar or scull approximately 9 1/2 feet long, usually made of composite materials. Three main parts are Blade (or spoon), Shaft (or loom) and Handle.

Oarlock - U-shaped swivel holding oar on rigger, fulcrum of lever created by oar; it is mounted on "sill" and rotates on upright "pin", with "gate" at top to secure oar in oarlock.

 $\boldsymbol{\mathsf{Old}}\ \boldsymbol{\mathsf{Boy}}\ \boldsymbol{\mathsf{-}}\ \mathsf{A}$ former oarsman or sculler still active in the sport, either as a coach, an executive or just a fan.

Oarsman or Oarswoman - The correct term for one who rows in a pair, a four or an eight.

Pair - A shell rowed by two athletes, each using a single sweep oar.

Pocock - A racing shell built by Pocock of Seattle, Washington.

Port - Left side of shell, facing forward (from stern forward, stroke, 6, 4, 2)

"Power 10 (or 20)" - Maximum effort by oarsmen for designated number of strokes.

Puddles - Whirlpools left in water by action of oar (see "Spacing").

Quad - A shell with four scullers, each using a pair of oars or sculls.

Race Distance - 2,000 metres (approx. 1 1/4 miles)

Racing Start - First strokes of a race, usually shorter and quicker than those used through body of race.

Rate or Rating - Number of strokes per minute being rowed by crew. This usually varies from 40 to 48 at the start, 32 to 38 in the body and 36 to 44 at the finish.

RCA or CARA - Rowing Canada Aviron (or previously Canadian Amateur Rowing Assn.), the National governing body for amateur rowing in Canada.

"Ready All?" - Preparatory command to get crew ready to row.

Recovery - Part of stroke cycle in which oar is returned to position for the drive (i.e. duration of cycle from release to catch when oars are out of the water), during which the oarsman's seat is moved from the bow end to the stern end of the slide

Repechage - In international races, the second chance race given those crews which fail to qualify from their opening heat. All the losers are drawn again and the repechage winners move on into the semi-finals or finals.

Rigger - Metal frame extending oarlock out form the side of boat to maintain constant distance (usually 32 to 35 in.) of oarlock from centre line of shell. Also now made of composite materials.

Rigging - Adjusting and altering accessories in shell such as outriggers, boot stretchers, tracks, sliding seats, etc, sometimes the accessories themselves.

Rudder - Steering device at stern of shell, often underneath boat next to "fin". Coxswain steers by pulling on ropes attached to the rudder (rudder ropes), or a rower steers by moving his foot which is attached by wires and a swivel device to control the steering. (A single sculler steers without a rudder, but with added length or pressure to one scull, in order to turn the boat.)

Run - Distance a shell is propelled by one stroke cycle; also the smooth run of the shell shown by the flow and smoothness of a crew.

Scull - Rowing using 2 smaller oars or sculls, with sculling boats being singles, doubles or quads. Also the word for the sculling oar. A sculler is one who sculls.

Senior - An oarsman or a sculler who is no longer an intermediate, due to his having won an intermediate race, or having won at Henley, US Nationals or any final at any international championship regatta.

Senior B - Age classification used for racing, for rowers who have not reached the age of 23 in the current year.

Shell - A boat built for racing, with eights usually 60 feet long and 24-26 inches wide at the widest point and weighing approximately 240lbs.

Skying - Faulty recovery or preparation for the catch in which the blade is too high above the water. Usually caused by the oarsman dropping his hands at the catch.

Slide - Tracks along which the sliding seat rolls.

Slide Control - Smoothness of slide movement or speed during the stroke cycle. "Rushing the Slide" is moving the seat too rapidly during the recovery. "Shooting the slide" is failing to keep the seat directly under oarsman during the drive.

Spacing - Distance between successive sets of puddles, which can show boat speed and run. This varies at different stroke rates.

Squaring - Turning of the oar blade perpendicular to the surface of the water in preparation for catch.

Stampfli - A rowing shell and oar manufacturer located in Zurich, Switzerland.

Standard Rig - Rigging of a shell where the stroke oar protrudes from the port side of the shell (or rower's right side) and each oar alternates sides of the boat up the boat to bow.

Starter - The official who starts each race. He is stationed in a tower behind the start and can see when each boat is ready and pointed straight down the race course.

Starting Commands - In international racing official commands used by the starter are "Attention - Go". (Was previously Etes Vous Prets - Partez) In Canadian rowing, a horn is used instead of the "Go". Boats are required to held at the start 2 minutes before their race, or they may be assessed a false start for being late to the start.

Starting Gate - A large steel structure at the starting line from which crews begin their race. Boat holders lie on their stomachs at the end of the boards protruding from the gates and they hold the sterns of the shells to assure an even start.

Stern - Rear of shell.

Stretcher - Cross bracing in the shell to which the shoes are fastened. They are adjustable to suit leg length. Also used to describe the wooden sawhorses upon which shells are placed when not on the storage racks.

Stroke - Oarsman in the farthest seat to the stern (No. 8 in an eight), who leads the crew in stroke rate and technique.

Team - A banned word. NEVER used in describing a crew or boat.

Vespoli - A shell produced by Vespoli U.S.A. of New Haven, Conn., U.S.A.

Washing Out - When oar blade comes out of water during drive - creating surface wash, losing power and unsteadying shell.

Weights - The bag of sand or steel weights required to be carried by those coxswains who weigh under the minimum.

Wind - Winds coming from different directions which can affect balance or stability for the boat and can affect the water conditions. Examples: Headwind, Tailwind, Crosswind or Quartering winds.






EIGHT

The largest of all rowing shells. It is manned by eight athletes, each using one sweep oar. A coxwain steers the boat.




PAIR

A shell rowed by two athletes, each using a single sweep oar.




DOUBLE

A shell in which two scullers row, each using a pair of sculls.




COX FOUR

A shell in which four athletes row, each rowing a single sweep oar. A coxwain steers the boat and calls the stroke.




QUAD

A shell in which four scullers row, each using a pair of oars or sculls.




FOUR
